


Image 1 Enlightened youth (Kaiming shaonian 开明少年), no. 56 Magazine Cover

## **DESCRIPTION**

This image shows children dressed as people from all walks of life working together for Chairman Mao and the Revolution. In the front row, a student, a farmer, a worker and a businessman hold hands. The businessman's sign says, 'Develop production.' In the early 1950s, some forms of private ownership were still allowed, but capitalists had to cooperate with the new system. Behind this row, *yangge* dancers perform, and soldiers hold up national flags. In the very middle of this row, a portrait of Chairman Mao adorns a large red star with rosettes on each point.

## **DESCRIPTION**
